Positive Discipline

Our school practices Positive Discipline.

5 criteria of Positive Discipline.

- 1. Helps children feel a sense of connection. (Belonging and significance)
- 2. Is mutually respectful and encouraging. (Kind and firm at the same time.)
- 3. Is effective long term. (Considers what the child is thinking, feeling, learning, and deciding about himself and his world and what to do in the future to survive or to thrive.)
- 4. Teaches important social and life skills. (Respect, concern for others, problem solving, communication, and cooperation as well as the skills to contribute to the home, school or larger community.)
- 5. Invites children to discover how capable they are. (Encourages the constructive use of personal power and autonomy.

- Working in the classroom every other week.
- Signing up for a job or committee.
- One maintenance work day in August
- Participating in Fundraising
- Attending monthly parent meetings for school business and Positive Discipline Parenting Class

Admission Requirements

- Two years of age prior to first day of school
- Potty-trained (or close to potty-trained).
- Children's health forms on file at the school as required by the State.
- Family members working in the classroom must provide a health screening report and vaccinations prior to working.
- All paperwork must be completed and turned in prior to starting class.
- Yearly Registration Fee \$150
